Most of the people and businesses with money were in the suburbs. They did not care what happened to the cities.

(B) During the 1950s there was another important change in American cities. Businesses began to leave the city, too. They left 15 because the people in the city were poorer. Poor people do not have much money to buy things. So many shops and restaurants moved out to the suburbs. People in the suburbs had much money to spend.

(C) Cities began to have many serious problems. The rich people 20 and the businesses did not pay city taxes any more. The poor people could not pay much money in taxes. So cities had less money for schools and housing. Sometimes they could not pay their police officers or firefighters. And they could not take good care of their streets and parks.

### 人口比率と経済

手引き

日本やヨーロッパなどの先進国では少子高齢化が大きな問題となっています。では、発展途上国はどうでしょうか。 中近栗の国々を例に取り上げ、問題点を探りましょう。

While many economically advanced countries, such as Japan, are facing an aging society, other countries face the opposite situation. In the case of countries in the Middle East region, there has been a rapid growth in the youth population. Currently, in those countries the number of people under the age of 24 is somewhere between 50 and 65 percent of the total population. (1)

The obvious problem in the short term concerns the pressure on the infrastructures of those Middle-Eastern countries. It will be difficult for the countries to offer adequate housing, schools or roads. Perhaps the biggest problem, though, is the shortage of available jobs. (2) Even those with university degrees find it extremely difficult to find a decent job. Not only is it a waste of talent to have such high unemployment among young people, but this situation is also contributing to social instability and is leading people towards having extreme political views.

Despite such problems, however, there are many economic advantages to be had from a rapidly expanding youth population. For instance, unlike the case in Europe, the U.S. or Japan, the countries in the Middle East do not face a crisis in their pension or healthcare systems. (3) Moreover, the abundance of available workers in the Middle East presents companies in the region with the ability for expanded production.

The growing youth population, combined with the rising price of oil, may present the Middle East with a great opportunity for economic development. (4) If that is done, the power of youth in the Middle East may lead to a transformation of the region.

## 女性解放と男性

手引き

今や世界の人口は 60 億をすでに突破し、いったいどこまで増えるのか心配ですが、人口が増えると何が起きるのでしょうか。ここでは女性の役割の変化という視点から考えてみましょう。

With the population explosion, the pressure on women to marry is going to be reduced, and the pressure to be mothers is going to be enormously reduced. For the first time in history we're not going to tell a woman that "your principal glory is to be (①)."

By telling women that their major job was to be wives and mothers, we told most men their major job was to be (②), so men often could not do the things they wanted to do most. We always talk about (③) women might have had, if they hadn't had those five children. But (④) looks at fathers and thinks what a wonderful life he'd have had if he hadn't had those five children.

He might have been able to paint instead of being a stockbroker. Or a musician, instead of running (inherited, store, a, he, jewelry). When you shut women up in a home and require wifehood and motherhood, you shut men up and require husbandhood and fatherhood at the same time. As we reduce the requirements for motherhood, we reduce the requirements for fatherhood. And we'll release a lot of people to be individuals and (to, as, contributions, individuals, make), rather than as parents.

# 地球と砂漠化

Throughout the world, about 60,000 square kilometers of land become desert each year. This means that a huge area of land, almost equal to the islands of Kyushu and Shikoku combined, is losing productivity each year. The situation is particularly severe in Africa. About one-third of the total land area is in danger of desertification, and this has affected nearly 80 percent of the farming population. The biggest causes of desertification are manmade, including overfarming and mismanagement of the land, and these are linked to the population explosion in developing countries.

In 1996, the Desertification Treaty was put into effect, and since then, a small number of countries have been moving forward with plans of action at the local level. However, worldwide awareness of desertification remains rather low, and funds are scarce. <u>③It</u> remains to be seen whether or not Africa can eventually be
